#### Travel assistance to school or college for students aged 16 to 25

Please note, there is no statutory requirement to provide travel assistance for post 16 students. Most students will be able to reasonably access their education or training independently and will not need any support with those arrangements.

However, some students, especially those with special educational needs or disability, may need support with travel arrangements to reasonably access their education or training. We are clear that as young people with special educational needs or disability approach adulthood, where travel assistance is appropriate it will be provided to support the young person's independence.
